Our Report-Writing course is based on the Calgary Police Service recruitment selection guidelines which demand that potential candidates successfully complete a written course component in order to be hired as police officers. Designed with these guidelines in mind, this Practical Edge Training course will ensure that security personnel are proficient in regards to essential skills for writing a professional incident report.
